



Out of thanksgiving and praise for the Lord's blessings to St. Paul's throughout 100 years of ministry, the offering taken during this afternoon's service will go towards supporting the construction of Lutheran churches and schools in Africa. Across Africa, congregations are usually able to build the four walls of their churches and schools using local materials like stones, wood, or baked mud bricks. The roofing is often an expense that is out of reach. As a result, structures might be left open to the sun (and rain) or topped with thatch roofs that require constant maintenance and repair. This project provides durable tin sheets to finish Lutheran church roofs. Together the local Lutheran church and the Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod provide a dry and long-lasting place for God to come to His people in the Word and the Sacraments. The cost for one such roof is around \$200.
